Synonyms: plummet, plunge, dive

Antonyms: rise,

Usage: "property prices tumbled"

9. All bets are off:

Meaning: That which seemed certain or foreseeable in the future is now completely

unpredictable.

Example: If all bets are off, then agreements

that have been made no longer apply

4. Slump -

Meaning: sit, lean, or fall heavily and limply.

Synonyms: flop, flump, collapse

Antonyms: stand up, sit up

Usage: "she slumped against the cushions"

10. up the spout

Meaning: No longer working or likely to be

useful or successful.

Example: If something has gone up the spout,

it has gone wrong or been ruined.
