Meaning: intimidate (someone), typically into doing something, with stern or abusive words.

Synonyms: bludgeon, intimidate, domineer,

subjugate

Antonyms: hamper, impede, hinder, Usage: The investigation officers are reportedly browbeating innocent political

activists to surrender

2. Apportioned (verb)-

Meaning: divide up and share out.

Synonyms: handout, allocate, assign

Antonyms: amass, reassemble, gather,

consolidate, concentrate

Usage: But the fluidic contiguity (nearby) of Pioneered, who chased ambition in one and a comfortable living in the other, has meant that they got blended in a concept called the National Capital Region or (NCR).
