Usage: "comments seen as implicit criticism

of the policies"

#### 2. Proactive -

**Meaning:** creating or controlling a situation rather than just responding to it after it has happened.

Synonyms: enterprising, take-charge,

energetic

Antonyms: reactive, responsive, chargeable

Usage: "employers must take a proactive

approach to equal pay"

### 3. Culpable –

Meaning: deserving blame.

Synonyms: to blame, guilty, at fault

Antonyms: blameless, innocent

Usage: "mercy killings are less culpable than

'ordinary' murders"

#### 4. Meticulous -

**Meaning:** showing great attention to detail;

very careful and precise.

Synonyms: careful, conscientious, diligent

Antonyms: careless, sloppy, slapdash Usage: "the designs are hand-glazed with

meticulous care"
