Meaning: strict, precise, and exacting.

Synonyms: strict, firm, rigid Antonyms: lenient, flexible

Usage: "stringent guidelines on air pollution"

Meaning: If an Australian says to you "Your blood is worth bottling", he/she **1S** complimenting or praising you for doing something or being someone very special.
