Meaning: exposed to the possibility of being attacked or harmed, either physically or

emotionally.

Synonyms: in danger, in peril, in jeopardy Antonyms: well protected, invulnerable,

resilient

Usage: "we were in a vulnerable position"

#### 3. Curtailment -

**Meaning:** the action or fact of reducing or

restricting something.

Synonyms: reduction, cut, cutback

Antonyms: increase, expansion

Usage: "the curtailment of human rights"

### 4. Ethos –

**Meaning:** the characteristic spirit of a culture,

era, or community as manifested in its

attitudes and aspirations.

Synonyms: spirit, character, atmosphere

Antonyms: abstract, exterior

**Usage:** "a challenge to the ethos of the

1960s"
