angry and bitter.

Synonyms: Bitter, Rancorous, Caustic,

Acerbic

Antonyms: Caring, Forgiving, Gentle,

Unbitter

Usage: An acrimonious dispute about wages.

2. Abrogate —

Definition: repeal or do away with (a law,

right, or formal agreement).

Synonyms: repudiate, revoke, repeal, rescind,

overturn

Antonyms: institute, introduce

**Usage**: "a proposal to abrogate temporarily

the right to strike"

3. Angst –

Meaning: a feeling of deep anxiety or dread, typically an unfocused one about the human

condition or the state of the world in general. **Synonyms:** anxiety, fear, dread

Antonyms: calmness, composure, ease

Usage: "the existential angst of the middle

classes"

4. Stymie –

**Definition:** Prevent or hinder the progress of.

Synonyms: Impede, Interfere with, Hamper,

Hinder, Obstruct

Antonyms: Assist, Help

Usage: The changes must not be allowed to

stymie new medical treatments.
