Usage: Saudi Arabia is upset that Oman and

Kuwait did not join the embargo.

2. Avert (Verb) -

Definition: Turn away (one's eyes or

thoughts).

Synonyms: Prevent, Stop, Avoid

Antonyms: Abet, Aid, Assist

Usage: The strong support among citizens of

all countries for urgent action to avert

dangerous climate change.

3. Furore (Noun) -

Definition: An outbreak of public anger or

excitement.

Synonyms: Commotion, Uproar, Outcry,

Disturbance

Antonyms: Calm, Calmness, Peace

Usage: The store's going-out-of-business sale

caused such a furore that security guards had

to be called in to restore order.

4. Palpable (Adjective) -

Definition: (of a feeling or atmosphere) so

intense as to seem almost tangible.

Synonyms: Perceptible, Perceivable, Visible,

Noticeable, Appreciable

Antonyms: Intangible, Imperceptible

Usage: A palpable sense of loss.
